

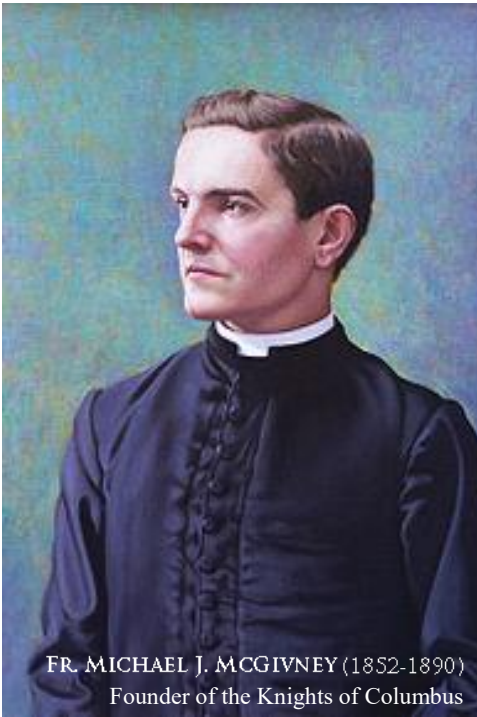

MISSION STATEMENT

Father McGivney Catholic High School has as its mission to:

SCHOOL HISTORY

Father McGivney Catholic High School is the seventh and newest Catholic high school to open in the Diocese of Springfield, Illinois. Opening its doors in 2012, FMCHS prides itself as a four-year, co-educational high school with a faith-based, college preparatory emphasis. FMCHS is the first and only high school in the diocese to be a 1:1 laptop school. The school opened its doors to our permanent school campus for the start of the 2015-2016 academic year with a student body of 125 students.

STUDENT POPULATION

Students are admitted to FMCHS without regard to race, religion, color, sex, nationality, or ethnic origin. Twelve percent of students are members of minority groups. Eight percent are non-Catholic. Financial assistance is available to all students, and approximately fifty-six percent receive aid.

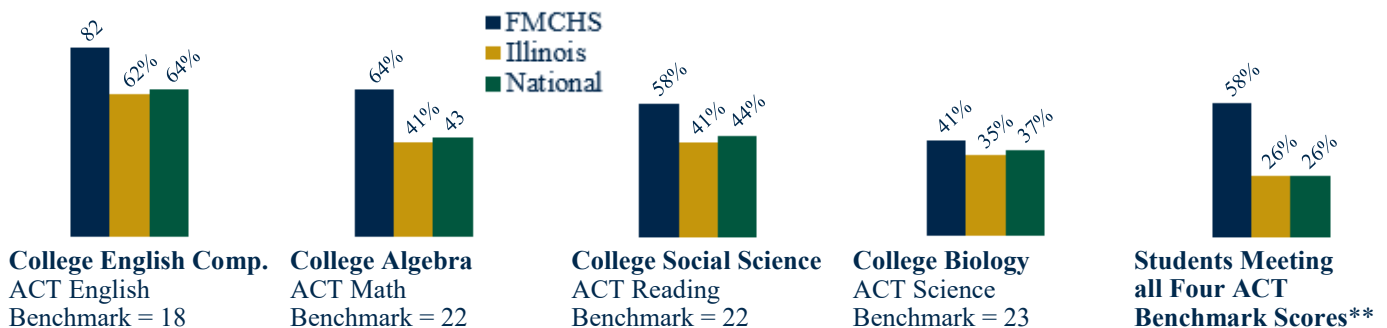
AVERAGE ACT COMPOSITE SCORES

Ninety-nine percent of FMCHS students have participated in the ACT since the inception of the school. The average ACT score listed below for the Class of 2016 is calculated by using the single highest score for each student.

** A benchmark score is the minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a "B" or higher or about a 75% chance of obtaining a "C" or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing course.

CURRICULUM

The standard school day consists of eight periods. Graduates are awarded a high school diploma and may also achieve a college preparatory diploma by satisfying the following minimum requirements.

**A student can only receive an incomplete at the end of the first and third quarters with administrative approval. A student has ten days after the last day of the quarter to finish the work or the incomplete will automatically become an "F".*

WEIGHTED GRADES AND CLASSES

For Honors, Dual Credit and Advanced Placement courses, a .02 add-on will be added to the semester GPA for that class and any subsequent Honors, Dual Credit, and Advanced Placement courses. Advanced Placement students are required to take the AP Exam. Failure to do so results in the AP not being placed on the permanent record. FMCHS offers 17 Honors courses, 4 Dual Credit courses and 4 Advanced Placement courses.

ACADEMIC HONORS

Students will be presented with academic medals for the following:

- Summa Cum Laude: Gold Medal (3.9-4.0 GPA)
- Magna Cum Laude: Silver Medal (3.7-3.899 GPA)
- Cum Laude: Bronze Medal (3.5-3.699 GPA)

In order to be eligible for these honors, the student must have completed the final three semesters of high school at Father McGivney Catholic High School, must have fulfilled the Community Service requirement and may not graduate early.

ACCREDITATION AND AFFILIATION

FMCHS is in candidate status with AdvancEd, is fully recognized by the Illinois State Board of Education, and is a member of the National Catholic Education Association and the Illinois High School Association.
